Request for Urgent Meeting

The Amahlathi Residence Association (ARA) represent numerous households, businesses and farmers in the greater Amahlathi area and is a registered non-profit company.


At a meeting held between the ARA and the appointed Administrator, the Acting Municipal Manager and Chief Financial Officer, on 3 July 2019, it became clear the Constitution Section 139(1)b and 139(5) gives the Administrator insufficient powers to implement the necessary interventions to ensure the financial stability of the municipality.

As it stands the municipality is systematically collapsing, since there are insufficient financial resources to deliver services and maintain the payroll. Every month the financial position of the municipality is worsening, while essential infrastructure is not being maintained and municipality is failing to service its debt, resulting in no refuse services, regular power outages and ESKOM threatening to put the town on 14 hours a day load shedding.

At the meeting ARA requested the administrator to arrange a meeting with the MEC of COGTA, however, he has subsequently advised us, the ARA need to write the MEC a letter requesting a meeting. We hereby request an urgent meeting with the MEC to allow the ARA to explain to the MEC that the current intervention is not working, since the council is unwilling to reverse the decisions that have bankrupted the municipality.
